

MEMORIALS IN OUR CHURCH

The Altar

Given by Mrs. W.T. Wohlford in memory of her parents, Captain and Mrs. Adolph Thies.

Pulpit

Given by the Ladies Aid Society. This is dated November 1, 1909.

Baptismal Font

Given in memory of his parents by T.L. Seigle. There is also a memorial window in the Young Peoples' Department given by Mr. Seigle. This window was behind the altar in the original brick church. We have been told that Mr. Seigle also gave the seats for the old church. Many of these are now being used in the Adult Auditorium of the Sunday School.

Altar Cross and Vases

Given in memory of F.C.E. Cranz and dated March 12, 1900. Professor Cranz was the first professor of music at Elizabeth College. He devoted his time and talent as organist at St. Mark's, without remuneration. When an accident rendered him almost helpless his friends carried him to the organ. His wife gave the beautiful cross and altar vases in his memory.

Lectern Bible

Presented to St. Mark's by St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Wilmington. No date is given.

Missile Stand

In memory of George J. Blum, Easter, 1924. Given by Mrs. Blum.

Altar Candlesticks

In memory of Ruth Snyder Overcarsh (Mrs. W.H.) and dated 1938. Mrs. Overcarsh was for many years a teacher in the Sunday School and a member of the choir where her husband served as choir director.

Receiving Bason and Offering Plates

Given by Mrs. W. L. Gray in memory of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. J.V. Sutton. Mr. Sutton was a former vice-chairman of the Church Council.
